Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs. This individual will lead the school in a major strategic goal: the development, evaluation, and dissemination of financially viable and innovative models of nursing practice; will be an active member of the larger University community, shaping relationships within the Duke University Health System and among the community-based providers who employ faculty appointees; and will contribute to teaching, service, and scholarship at the School. The ADCA will report directly to the Dean. The successful candidate will have doctoral preparation and demonstrated abilities in practice plan development and work with faculty and other Associate Deans to integrate the School's practice and scholarship activities. Health care business and compliance experience related to clinical practice is required. Expertise in the translation of practice model outcomes for broader audiences and dissemination of outcomes in the professional literature is expected. Rank commensurate with accomplishments. North Carolina registered nurse licensure eligibility required.

Director of Translation Institute. The Director will be responsible for the development and conduct of the School's newest research unit, and its linkage with Duke University Hospital and its nursing staff; and for the collaborative development of a translational research agenda and the implementation of research on care outcomes and evidence based practice. The Director will report to the Dean for translational research activities, and will be accountable to the Chief Nursing Officer of the Duke University Health System for hospital translation research implementation. Qualified candidates will be doctorally-prepared, eligible for appointment as a senior faculty, and have a history of experience and progressive leadership in research administration, as well as outstanding productivity in grantsmanship and research. Significant clinical nursing services collaboration required.

Nursing Education. This individual will contribute to the development of an innovative program designed to prepare future educators in nursing. The School's strategic agenda identifies technology-based innovation in teaching as a priority and this faculty member will provide leadership around curriculum and instruction. Teaching responsibilities will support the nursing education specialty and a defined second interest area. The incumbent will be expected to assume a strategic leadership role in the School's simulation center and assist with the preparation of the planned DNP curriculum. Rank and tenure commensurate with accomplishments.
